Summary of the Council Meeting

Ten elected church officers attended the meeting on June 18th. Pastor McPike was present at the meeting via telephone. Secretary Deb Lammle read the minutes from the April meeting, and they were approved. Treasurer Terri Hooker gave the treasurers report with total expenses for May as \$14,512.67 and total income of \$4570. The checking account as of May 30, 2025, was \$52,451,66. With a few corrections, the treasurers' report was approved.

Pastor McPike has arranged for Pastor Strom to preach June 22, July 20, August 24, and August 31. He also has contacted Pastor Frank to preach September 28th, October 26th, and November 2nd. Reformation Sunday/Pastor Appreciation will be October 19th, and All Saints Sunday will be celebrated on November 9th. Pastor is working on fixing the trouble with recording the church services.

The trustee report centered on the mold issue. It was recommended to purchase and install a HVAC UVC light unit as recommended by Darwin Warsaw at the quarterly meeting. The estimated cost is \$50-\$100 plus the installation of an electrical outlet if needed. It was voted NOT to proceed with the ServPro mold cleaning work at this time. Jeff Warsaw will contact JC Heating and Cooling who installed the new dehumidifier in the church to adjust the new dehumidifier in an attempt to reach 40% humidity. 30-50% is the ideal range for humidity in the church. We will continue to monitor the humidity level through the balance of the year.

A motion was made to purchase a Milwaukee brand 20 volt leaf blower for the church with a second battery pack. The motion was approved to make the purchase. It was stated that the new dehumidifier in the hall is working great, but the need to empty the water is required several times a day. Members coming into the hall during the week were urged to empty the dehumidifier. A discussion followed on ways to get rid of the collected water by draining it to the outside. A new changeable church sign has been ordered for west of the church on the Mansfield/ Bellflower Road and will be installed upon receipt. A new sign has also been ordered and received for Route 54.

The Mission Outreach Committee will be meeting soon to review responses from the surveys. Don and Connie Warsaw, Dwight and Terri Hooker, and Brenda Hendricks will head the committee to serve the Lloyd Power farm sale in rural Bellflower in August. Pastor McPike has provided the council with information on Church Mutual Insurance. Jerry Niemann will request a quote and investigate the proposal.

The council decided not to construct a float for the Bellflower July 4th parade. 400 bottles of water will be purchased to be passed out during the parade in Bellflower. Labels with our church name will

be attached to the bottles by five council volunteers. The council gave approval to purchase stamps before the price goes up to council treasurer and church secretary.

Chairman Lammle then reviewed the Activities List for 2025. The Bring a Friend to Church with social hour afterwards is set for August 3rd. It was decided to have the picnic at the church hall with children's games being provided in August. Several avenues of advertising for our church were discussed.

The next council meeting will be held Wednesday, July 23rd.

LWML National Convention

The LWML National Convention was held in Omaha, Nebraska on June 26-29. There were many activities, worship services, servant events, and Bible studies scheduled at this convention. One of the activities which has been a tradition for many years was a mission walk. The walk took place on the bridge that separates Iowa and Nebraska. Connie Warsaw and Brenda Hendricks attended this event. They would like to thank the three members who contributed to their pledges collected which will be used to support the mission grants for the 2025-2027 biennial that were voted on at the convention. The theme "Growing in God's Grace" – 2 Peter 3:18 - was indeed evident in the Mites in Action speakers, the Bible studies, the worship services, and the servant events. Connie and Brenda will share their experience at the July Ladies Aid/LWML meeting.


